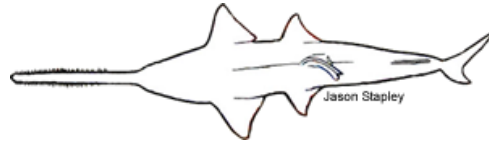


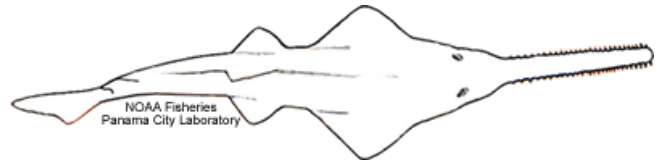
WHAT SAWFISHES CAN YOU SEE IN THE SEA?

There are 5 different types or 'species' of sawfish: the green sawfish, dwarf sawfish, smalltooth sawfish, largetooth sawfish and narrow sawfish. The different sawfish species look similar but if you look close enough they are different.

- The **narrow sawfish** has no rostral teeth on the bottom fourth of its saw, and has a large lower tail fin.
- The **dwarf sawfish** has no lower tail fin, and its body is rather small and narrow compared to the other sawfishes.
- The first dorsal or top fin of the **largetooth sawfish** is in front of its pelvic fins (small fins on the bottom side of the fish), and has a small lower tail fin.
- The **green sawfish** has rostral teeth that are far apart at the start and closer at the tip of the saw, has no lower tail fin and can have a greenish skin color.
- The **smalltooth sawfish** is like the green sawfish, but is the only sawfish found in Florida, USA (captures of the largetooth sawfish in Florida are very rare).
