Sawfish Conservation Society



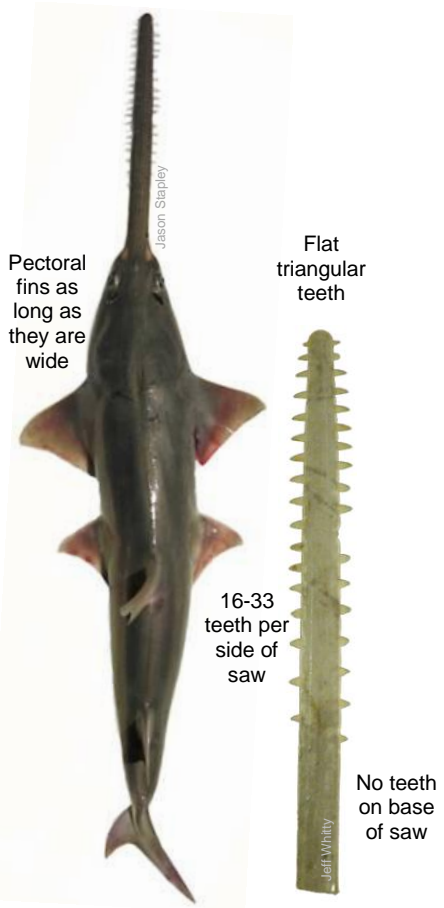
This guide illustrates the key features unique to each species of sawfish found in the **Indian and Pacific Oceans**. Features are only listed if they vary from the typical form (i.e. dorsal fin above/slightly behind pelvic fins, teeth occur on entirety of the saw, peg/awl shaped teeth on saw, tooth gap at tip of saw smaller than preceding gap, all teeth similar in length). (*Anoxypristis cuspidata*)

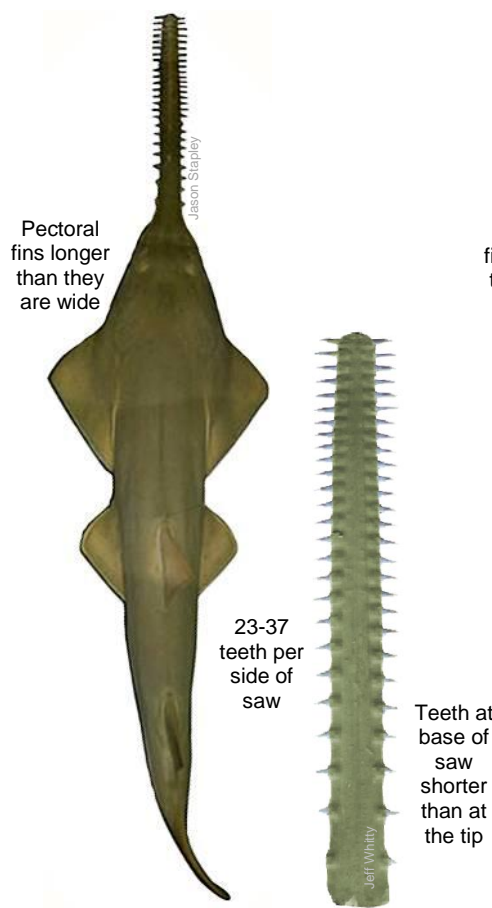
Green/Longcomb sawfish

(*Pristis clavata*)

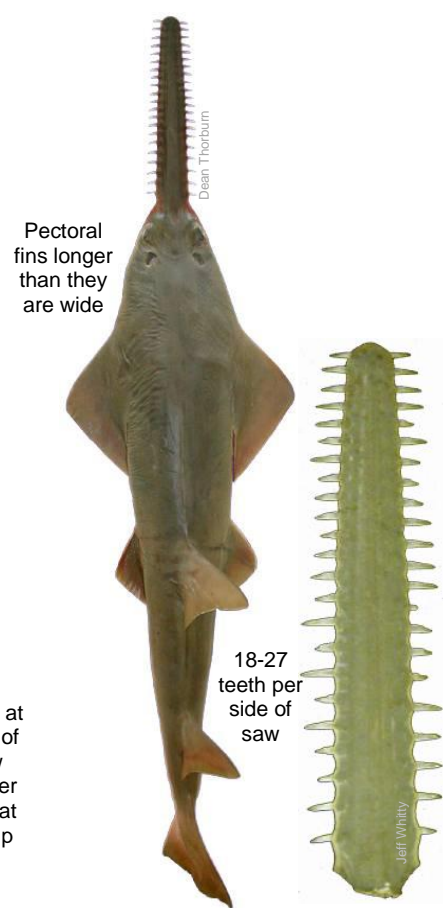
Large-tooth/Freshwater sawfish
(*Pristis pristis*)



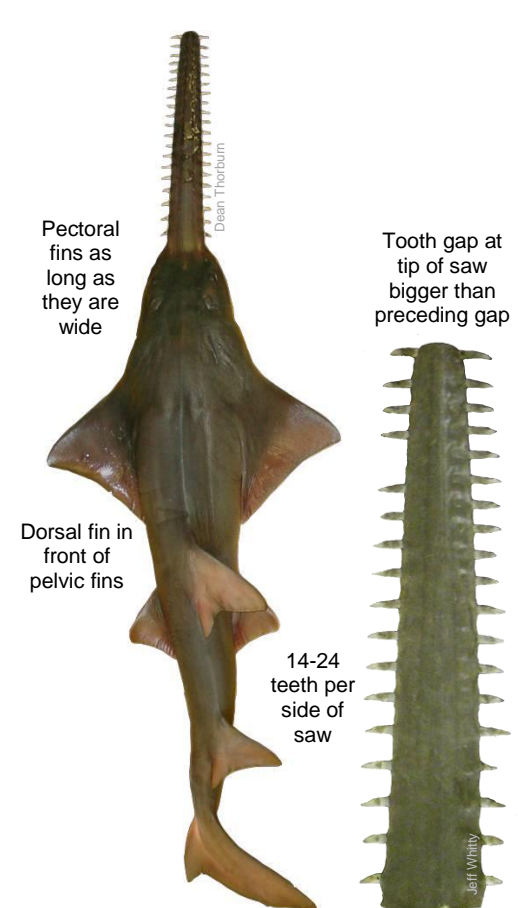
Forked tail
